Hence, it is the responsibility of the manufacturer to provide their products with the necessary protection. This can be a Stretch wrap on shipping pallets or heavy bulk products to minimize the possibility of damage during transport. It can be applied by hand or with the use of a machine.

Steel strap is another protective device to ensure no harm will affect your products on their way to your intended destination. It can be made of low carbon cold-rolled steel designed for light to medium-duty applications. Or it can also be made of high carbon heat-treated steel for medium to heavy-duty chores, where extra strength and flexibility are required.

It can either be made of polypropylene or polyester plastic and may be an effective replacement for steel strapping.
