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Apart from those rare days when it is pouring with rain, Cornwall is in most respects just as appealing in the Winter and Spring as it is in Summer and early Autumn. The North Coast is much better known for its wide sandy beaches and the towering cliffs around Tintagel and the Hartland Peninsula. Either way, there is plenty for visitors to enjoy regardless of the weather.

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
