There is a circular duck pond built in 1925, featuring a central island. The Coronation Clump, a clustering of trees, commemorates the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953.

For those of a scientific persuasion, there is the Genetic Garden. This was built according to the precepts of Professor Cyril Darlington, to demonstrate evolution in microcosm.
