This is a particularly good option for travellers who want to stick to a specific budget. However, if the meals at the all-inclusive resort aren't tasty, you may end up paying more to eat elsewhere. Buying your own flights, accommodation and all other related expenses separately may be more work, but ultimately it allows you to plan your holiday the way you want to.

Booking accommodation, then, is the next step on your checklist for travellers not going on an all-inclusive holiday. Before booking, it's important to consider a few questions.
