Be wary of unsolicited emails. Fortunately, these days, the email services themselves have various tools to filter out the unsolicited junk mails and put them in the "spam"™ box. Even if some of them slip through the filtering process and land up on your Inbox, just see to that the content is sensible. Never fall prey to the mails that ask for your personal information.

Create unique passwords for all your online accounts. Make sure you create strengthened passwords. Shorter passwords are easy to hack as they require less coding for the hackers. Maintain different passwords for various online accounts like email, social networking sites, Internet banking etc. and make sure you make a note of the new passwords as and when you change them.
